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We support the policy, but would have preferred a bit more emphasis and use of the word 'sustainable' relating to existing infrastructure rather than new development. More criteria to retain and enhance existing buildings would reflect the principles of item 70 of the National Planning Policy Framework to ensure that established facilities and services are retained and able to develop for the benefit of the community.

We note the statement at para.8.137 that 'community and cultural facilities are also important to the overall wellbeing of the community and these should be protected and if necessary enhanced.'

We would like to see the word 'protected' within the policy wording please for clarity and consistency. It has been included in Policy BDP25 in the first sentence and this sentence should be repeated for BDP12 as the intention is the same – protect, retain and enhance.

Museums, libraries, and all community and cultural facilities play a key role in encouraging knowledge, experience and quality of life in its broadest sense. The information and stimulation these facilities can offer promotes a wider understanding of the world and offers individuals the opportunity to acquire new skills and knowledge to enjoy a rich and varied cultural life.

Although this does not affect the document's soundness, there doesn't seem to be a description for the term 'Community Facilities' except for a few examples in para.8.135, and recommend this succinct all-inclusive description which would obviate the need to provide examples: community facilities provide for the health and wellbeing, social, educational, spiritual, recreational, leisure and cultural needs of the community. This should also be included in the Glossary for consistency and clarity.
